












SCHOLARSHIP UPDATE

MEAKERALA



Since 2000, the MEA Scholarship Project has provided continuous support to well-deserving students in Kerala and has achieved operational excellence. Around 2012, Vijay Kayath was instrumental in organizing former MEA awardees into a group with a goal of exploring ways to include them in helping future awardees in their academic, career and financial prospects. Vijay met with some of the past awardees during his trips to India, helping form a small number of committed engineers engaging in this mission of reciprocating meaningful support to other deserving MEA awardees.

The group was named MEAK and they had an MOU with another charitable group in Kerala, 'CETA-Galaxy/ HOPE', initially to facilitate banking operations to collect and distribute funds for the MEAK scholarship award. At this time, MEAK is operating independently and is in the process of registering as a charitable organization in Kerala.

The MEA alumni who support MEAK have grown in numbers and have reached a critical quorum to maintain their activity. The COVID pandemic hampered their progress, but they have resurged with renewed support. The scholarships awarded in Indian rupees are of a lesser amount and are fully supported by donations received in rupees in India. MEA Houston does not provide any funding and does not have any administrative controls over the scholarship program in India.

Over the past few years, MEAK has been able to sponsor one or two students each year from those who were shortlisted for an MEA award, thanks to the persistent efforts of a small volunteer-core. The process for receiving an MEAK award is as follows: First, the MEA Scholarship evaluation committee releases a short-list of finalists (typically, around 25) after processing the large pool of applications it receives every year.

Each finalist undergoes a verification process, where a MEA volunteer visits the student's home in Kerala and produces a report verifying the criteria-based aspects of the student's application, to the MEA Scholarship evaluation committee.

The Scholarship evaluation committee then produces a ranked list of eligible students for an award. MEA scholarships are awarded to students from this list based on the annual fundraising budget. From finalists that were not awarded MEA scholarships due to funding limitations, MEAK selects one or two students for an MEAK award.

This year, MEAK will be able to support at least two students, thanks to contributions from past MEA alumni and a generous sponsor in India.

For MEA members, friends, and family, contributing to MEAK scholarship fundraisers using funds based in India opens up avenues for supporting the Scholarship Project. All of us at MEA Houston look forward to the growth of MEAK and engagement amongst MEA alumni, as they multiply the efforts of the MEA Scholarship Project.




