

MEA 2005 Scholarship Award Update

For the year 2005, we received over 130 applications for our scholarship program from first year engineering students in Kerala. As in the previous years, the scholarship committee, after a rigorous process of evaluation short listed a select group of 11 deserving candidates. Individual contacts were established with the short-listed candidates via email, telephone, faculty at the colleges and several friends and family in Kerala who helped in verifying information on the applications including need for financial assistance. Now came the tough job of eliminating some more from well accomplished and almost equally deserving applicants; and the task was difficult, but the evaluation committee comprising of Vijay Kayath, George Mathew, Meera Nair, Ranjith Nair and Hariharan with able guidance from Sojan Antony, Sibi Kuruvilla were very focused and stuck to the task and completed the effort as scheduled by January 31st 2006.

'Shyama, the Mystical Indian Woman' By Sibi Kuruvilla

This year's fundraiser was an event that will linger in memory as one of the best shows that MEA has presented in the past few years. The dance show by Shobana and troupe, 'Shyama, the Mystical Indian Woman', was at the Stafford Civic Center on Gandhi-Jayanthi day and drew a huge capacity-crowd, in true testament to Shobana's star-power and MEA's organizing prowess. All the MEA committee members and volunteers who helped put together the event deserve kudos for their effort.

Dr.Rathnakumar of Anjali School of Dance was the MC for the program. The evening started off with a tribute to Mahatma Gandhi in a mutli-media presentation that spanned the life and mission of the great man, with a live rendering of 'Vaishnav Jan To Tene Kahiye', the hymn immortalized by Gandhiji. It was a preservation of timeless hope to remember this great man of peace and uncompromising integrity, in this era of rife and senseless violence around the world.

Shobana packaged a presentation especially for Houston, with Malayalam narrative and had a routine choreographed to A.R.Rahman's 'Vande Matharam'. The show was crafted in Shobana's master-strokes to entertain both the connoisseur and lay rasika, with some vibrant and graceful choreography that was innovative, while still retaining the classicism of Nrithya. The accompanying dancers were all longtime students of Shobana's at her dance-school, 'Kalarpana', in Madras.

The show started with classical Bharathanatyam pieces. The Anjali in Nattai ragam had the melody of vocal rendition and the rhythm of the bells on the dancers' feet that pierced the silence, creating a sense of unsullied purity. Rich orchestration and excellent dance sequences, sometimes performed alone, sometimes in a group, characterized the presentation. This was followed by a beautiful portrayal of Kaali, depicting the goddess' mysticism, her different forms ranging from the fierce to the benign, while detailing the abstractions of the Kali yantra, the Kundalini shakthi, and tantric worship including the partaking of the panchamakara. There was plenty of dramatic content in the gory mutilation of demons, in the drunken stupor of the goddess, and in the practice of sacrifice in worship. A solo dance depicting Nandanar by Bhavani, in an unhurried graceful flow, seemed to mark the transition from classical to 'freer' expression. The story of Shyama, a bride from rural India whose wedding is the context of the piece, was presented to the delight of the spectators, who responded heartily to the humor it contained. It followed Shyama from the proposal from a groom 'who has studied abroad', through the negotiations on her dowry which included a late demand for a 'two-wheeler', to domestic life after her wedding. This superb entertainer was followed by what amazingly seemed like a Thillana set to Bach. There was also a lively group piece set to a background of great percussion.

Shobana and her troupe of well-seasoned dancers left the spectators charmed in an enchanted experience of scintillating choreography and soulful music at the event.


The cover charges are:
